International Connections in Education and Development, ICED, is glad to invite you to our first conference, *'Education for a Better Future: Education for Peace'*, which will be held on Saturday 2nd April, 2011 at the Institute of Education, University of London.

'Education for a Better Future: Education for Peace' Conference

The event's organisers encourage students, researchers and professionals interested in the field to present their work. To do so, the completion of an abstract submission form will be required, which is found on our website: http://icedglobal.weebly.com/events.html

Deadlines

The abstract submission form deadline will be **Monday 21st February 2011 by 5pm.** You will need to send the correspondent document to: icedglobal@gmail.com

The papers shortlisted will be published on our website http://icedglobal.weebly.com/events.html on Monday 28th February 2011. We will also send an email to each potential presenter to notify the results.

If your work is selected, you will need to submit a written summary of your work and a Power Point presentation. You will also need to provide a more detailed plan to lead an 'advisory board discussion' with the key outcomes you want to achieve. All sent via email on Friday 25th March 2011 by 5pm.

Presentation

- Each presentation will last 15 minutes, followed by an 'advisory board discussion' of 45 minutes
- Authors may use audio/visual tools like 'Power Point'
- Presentations will be scheduled in parallel sessions of the same category
- You will be informed of the time and venue of your session by Monday 28th March 2011, but know that all presentations will be held in person (no video conferences) on Saturday 2nd April 2011 between 10am and 3.30pm

Resources:

A PC, whiteboard to project your presentation and microphones will be provided. If you require any other technical support (i.e. video projection, other audio/visual resources) please notify the event's organisers and they will make sure they support you the best way possible.

Both the written work and the Power Point presentation will be uploaded in our website to be accessed by participants after the event, as well as other ICED and BAICE members.

Flip-chart paper and markers will be provided for the 'advisory board discussions'. If you have any other ideas of materials you could use for the 'advisory board discussions', you would be welcome to bring them along on your own expense and make sure you notify the event's organisers first.

Guidelines for submission of abstract:

- Abstracts should only be submitted via email, on : icedglobal@gmail.com The abstracts must be attached as a word document using the 'abstract submission form' which can be downloaded from our website: http://icedglobal.weebly.com/events.html
- There is a limit of one submission per project



- A paper can only be submitted by one person, but that representative can acknowledge that the research or the project has been undertaken by more than one author
- All abstracts must be submitted and presented in English, the official language of the event
- Abstracts should be based on the theme of 'Education for Peace'

The event's organisers have interpreted the theme as follows: The role of Education towards the prevention and or rebuilding of nations who have been affected by conflict or natural disasters. We believe there is a direct correlation between Education and the propagation of Peace.

ICED is particularly interested in innovative initiatives such as the increasing use of technology in order to generate better educational chances. Applicants are therefore encouraged to 'think outside the box' in terms of ideas for Education for Peace.

- Authors must indicate their category (student/researcher/professional), in the abstract submission form
- Abbreviations should be defined the first time they appear in your text. Example: Higher Education Area (HEA), before being used as an abbreviation only. Please, do not define or use abbreviations in the title
- Please, avoid complex mathematical formulas. For the symbols ≤ or ≥, type instead <= or >=
- Tables, charts or other graphics may not be included in the abstract, but if your work is selected, then you can include this in your final paper and/or Power Point presentation
- Abstracts may not be longer than 750 words
- The minimum number of words for an abstract to be reviewed is 250
- The event's organisers reserve the right to decide on the final allocation and presentation category
- After submitting your abstract, you will receive an e-mail confirming your submission. If you do
 not receive any confirmation within 2 days, please contact the ICED event's organisers:

- If you wish to make any corrections to an abstract already submitted, you may contact the event's organisers on icedglobal@gmail.com
- If your abstract has been accepted, your final paper must be from 2 to 10 pages long, the Power Point presentation should be as long as you wish as long as presenting it doesn't exceed 15 minutes, you will need to provide a more detailed outline of leading your 'advisory board discussion' details of all this will be specified to the authors of the papers accepted
- Presenters will not need to pay to present their work, they will have the chance to network with keynote speaker and participants, they will be able to access the website after the event for future reference and for downloading the resources shared
